1 AN ACT to make appropriations for the fiscal biennium commencing July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2022; providing definitions; providing for 2 3 appropriations and transfers of funds for the period of the budget and for the remainder of the current biennium as specified; providing for carryover 4 of certain funds beyond the biennium as specified; providing for employee 5 positions as specified; providing for duties, terms and conditions and other 6 7 requirements relating to appropriations for the remainder of the current biennium and the period of the budget as specified; providing for position 8 9 and other budgetary limitations; amending existing law by redirecting revenues and making transfers for the period of the budget; providing for 10 reports related to appropriations; and providing for effective dates. 11
