Fishing task force.

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; creating the fishing task
- 2 force; authorizing consulting services; authorizing
- 3 agreements with other agencies; requiring a report;
- 4 providing appropriations; and providing for an effective
- 5 date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 Section 1.

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- 11 (a) There is created the fishing task force
- 12 consisting of:

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- (i) Five (5) members with professional fishing
- 15 guide experience from river basins across Wyoming, none of

1 whom shall be from the same county, appointed by the 2 governor; 3 4 (ii) One (1) member who shall be the director of the Wyoming game and fish department or the director's 5 6 designee; 7 8 (iii) One (1) member of the senate appointed by 9 the president of the senate; 10 (iv) One (1) member 11 of the house of 12 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of 13 representatives; 14 (v) One (1) member from the Wyoming state board 15 16 of outfitters and professional guides appointed by the 17 governor; 18 19 (vi) Two (2) members of the licensed fishing 20 public appointed by the governor. 21 The governor shall appoint co-chairs for the task 22 (b) 23 force.

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(c) The task force shall study the impact of commercial and public fishing on the quality of the fisheries in Wyoming's major river basins, including analysis of social and biological impacts of fishing. To accomplishing its duties under this section, the task force shall consult with federal land management agencies that regulate or permit fishing in Wyoming. The task force

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shall:

11 (i) Examine historic usage in each river basin
12 and identify which stretches of rivers are experiencing the
13 largest increases in traffic;

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15 (ii) Examine each river basin and identify 16 perceived overcrowding issues on stretches of rivers. For 17 each stretch of river identified as having perceived 18 overcrowding, the task force shall:

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20 (A) Identify potential solutions to the 21 overcrowding of the stretch of river;

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1	(B) Study current, historic and increases
2	in usage of the stretch of the river.
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4	(iii) Identify which stretches of rivers are
5	currently regulated or permitted with regard to commercial
6	fishing, including:
7	
8	(A) The nature of the regulations or
9	permits;
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11	(B) Which federal, state or local agency
12	enacts and enforces the regulations or issues and enforces
13	the permits;
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15	(C) Any enforcement issues related to the
16	regulations or permits.
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18	(iv) Identify which stretches of rivers are
19	currently not regulated or permitted with regard to
20	commercial fishing;
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22	(v) Identify whether access to the stretches of
23	rivers at Wyoming office of state lands and investments or

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1 Wyoming game and fish department access points may be

2 regulated or permitted with regard to the number of

3 commercial fishing parties allowed within a specified time

4 frame;

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6 (vi) Identify other uses extrinsic to fishing

7 and habitat conditions that may result in future regulation

8 of fishing or stretches of rivers;

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10 (vii) Recommend solutions to areas of concern

11 identified in paragraphs (i) through (vi) of this

12 subsection and identify the costs to incorporate those

13 solutions.

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15 (d) To facilitate the task force in accomplishing its

16 duties under this section, the Wyoming game and fish

17 department may enter into agreements:

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(i) With any federal land management agency that

20 regulates or permits commercial fishing in Wyoming to allow

21 for consultation on regulation and permitting of commercial

22 fishing trips and on enforcement of commercial fishing

23 regulation and permits;

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2 (ii) With the Wyoming office of state lands and

3 investments to:

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5 (A) Inventory state land access points to

6 stretches of river used for commercial and public fishing;

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8 (B) Inventory all usage of access points to

9 stretches of river as compared to permitted use; and

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11 (C) Collaborate on a plan to create a

12 permitting process that controls the number of commercial

13 fishing trips on stretches of rivers that the task force

14 identifies as warranting regulation or restriction.

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16 (e) The task force shall report its findings and any

17 recommendations, including any recommended legislation, to

18 the joint travel, recreation, wildlife and cultural

19 resources interim committee and the governor on or before

20 October 10, 2021. The joint travel, recreation, wildlife

21 and cultural resources interim committee shall review the

22 report and any recommended legislation for potential

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1 sponsorship during the 2022 session of the legislature. The

2 task force shall cease to exist on December 31, 2021.

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4 (f) Subject to available funding, the task force may recommend to the governor retention of consultants as 5 necessary to fulfill its duties under this section. State 6 agencies shall provide information and assistance to the 7

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10 The task force shall be staffed by the Wyoming (q) game and fish department. The legislative members of the 11 task force shall be paid salary, per diem and mileage 12 expenses in the manner and amount prescribed by W.S. 13 28-5-101 and 28-5-102. Members of the task force who are 14 state employees shall be considered on official business of 15 16 their agency or office and shall receive mileage and per 17 diem in the manner provided by their agency or office. Any other member of the task force shall not receive salary but 18 19 shall receive mileage and per diem at the same rate as 20 members of the Wyoming legislature under W.S. 28-5-101 and 28-5-102 for each day of actual task force meetings and 21 22 travel to those meetings.

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1 Section 2.

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(a) There is appropriated one hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000.00) from the general fund to the Wyoming game and fish department. This appropriation shall only be expended to pay mileage and per diem for nonlegislative members of the task force, to pay for any consultant as approved by the governor and to pay any other costs related

to the implementation of this act.

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11 (b) There is appropriated ten thousand dollars
12 (\$10,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative
13 service office. This appropriation shall only be expended
14 for salary, mileage and per diem of legislative members
15 appointed to the task force.

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17 (c) Funds appropriated under this section shall be
18 for the period beginning with the effective date of this
19 act and ending December 31, 2021. Notwithstanding any other
20 provision of law, the appropriations in this section shall
21 not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and
22 any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from these

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1 appropriations shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

2 2022.

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4 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

5 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

6 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

7 Constitution.
