## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to the University of Wyoming board of 2 trustees; providing for selection of prospective appointees 3 by the electorate and providing for gubernatorial 4 appointment; authorizing removal for cause; modifying 5 trustee terms; conforming provisions; repealing an 6 inconsistent provision; providing applicability; and 7 providing for an effective date. 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10 Section 1. W.S. 22-18-113 is created to read: 11 12 13 22-18-113. Applicability to members of the University 14 of Wyoming board of trustees. 15

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This chapter shall not apply to the selection and
 appointment of members to the University of Wyoming board
 of trustees.

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Section 2. W.S. 9-1-202(a), 21-17-201, 21-17-202(a)
and by creating new subsections (c) and (d), 21-17-203,
22-1-102 by creating a new subsection (b),
22-2-105(a)(ii)(intro), 22-4-304(a), 22-5-206(a),
22-5-208(a)(i), 22-5-215, 22-6-117(a) by creating a new
paragraph (xii), 22-6-120(a)(x), 22-16-116, 22-16-121(b)
and 22-25-107(a)(iii) are amended to read:

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139-1-202. Removal of appointive officers and14commissioners; reason for removal to be filed.

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16 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law and except as otherwise provided in this section, any person 17 may be removed by the governor, at the governor's pleasure, 18 19 if appointed by the governor to serve as head of a state 20 agency, department or division, or as a member of a state 21 board or commission. The governor may only remove a member of the Wyoming business council as provided in W.S. 22 23 9-12-103. The governor may only remove a member of the

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University of Wyoming board of trustees as provided in W.S. 1 2 21-17-202. 3 4 21-17-201. Composition; selection and appointment; 5 quorum. б The government of the university is vested in a board of 7 8 twelve (12) eight (8) trustees appointed by the governor, 9 no two (2) of whom may be residents of the same county of 10 the state in accordance with this section. At least One (1) 11 trustee shall be appointed from each of the seven (7) 12 appointment district pursuant to districts designated in W.S. 9-1-218. Not more than seventy-five percent (75%) of 13 14 the members of the board shall be registered in the same political party. The electors of each appointment district 15 16 at a general election shall select two (2) prospective 17 appointees for the applicable trustee position. On or about January 15 immediately following a general election, the 18 19 governor shall appoint one (1) of the two (2) prospective 20 appointees to fill an open position. In addition, at a 21 general election the electors of the state shall select two (2) prospective appointees to be chairman of the board of 22 trustees. On or about January 15 immediately following a 23

general election, the governor shall appoint one (1) of the 1 2 two (2) prospective appointees to fill the position of 3 board chairman. All appointees shall be subject to the 4 advice and consent of the senate. The governor, the president of the university, the state superintendent of 5 public instruction and the president of the associated б students of the university are members ex officio, having 7 8 the right to speak, but not to vote. A majority of the 9 board is a quorum. 10 11 21-17-202. Term; vacancies; members of faculty 12 disgualified; removal. 13 14 (a) The term of office of the trustees appointed is six (6) four (4) years. During each session of the 15 legislature, the governor shall nominate, and with the 16 17 advice and consent of the senate, appoint successors to those trustees whose term of office has expired or will 18 19 expire before the next session of the legislature. Any 20 vacancy in the board of trustees caused by death, 21 resignation, removal from the state, failure of the senate to confirm appointment in the first legislative session 22 following appointment or otherwise, shall be filled by 23

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appointment by the governor as provided in  $\frac{W.S. 28-12-101}{W.S. 28-12-101}$ 1 2 this section. 3 4 (c) The governor shall fill a vacancy in the board of trustees by appointing the prospective appointee selected 5 through election for the trustee position under W.S. 6 7 21-17-201 but not appointed by the governor. That appointee 8 may serve as trustee for the remainder of the term unless the senate fails to confirm the appointment in the 9 10 legislative session first following appointment, in which 11 case the trustee position shall be vacant. Subsequent 12 vacancies in a trustee position prior to a general election 13 at which prospective appointees are to be selected shall be filled for the remainder of the term in accordance with the 14 15 following: 16

17 (i) The governor shall immediately notify in 18 writing the chairman of the state central committee of the 19 political party which last represented the trustee position 20 at the time of appointment. The chairman shall call a 21 meeting of the state central committee to be held not later 22 than fifteen (15) days after he receives notice of the 23 vacancy. At the meeting the state central committee shall

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1	select and transmit to the governor the names of three (3)
2	persons qualified to hold the trustee position. Within five
3	(5) days after receiving these three (3) names, the
4	governor shall fill the vacancy by appointment of one (1)
5	of the three (3) to hold the position. If the person who
6	has vacated the position did not represent a political
7	party at the time of appointment the governor shall notify
8	in writing the chairman of all state central committees of
9	parties registered with the secretary of state. Each state
10	central committee shall submit to the governor, within
11	fifteen (15) days after notice of the vacancy, the name of
12	one (1) person qualified to hold the position. The
13	governor shall also cause to be published in a newspaper of
14	general circulation in the state notice of the vacancy in
15	the position. Persons qualified to hold the position who
16	do not belong to a party may, within fifteen (15) days
17	after publication of the vacancy in the position, submit a
18	petition signed by one hundred (100) registered voters,
19	seeking consideration for appointment. Within five (5)
20	days after receiving the names of qualified persons, the
21	governor shall fill the vacancy by appointment, from the
22	names submitted or from those petitioning for appointment.
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1 (d) No member of the faculty, while holding that 2 position, shall ever be appointed a trustee. The governor 3 may only remove any <u>a</u> trustee as provided in W.S. 9-1-202 4 for cause.

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6 21-17-203. To be body corporate; powers, duties and 7 functions generally.

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9 The board of trustees and their successors in office 10 constitute a body corporate by the name of "the trustees of the University of Wyoming". They possess all the powers 11 12 necessary or convenient to accomplish the objects and 13 perform the duties prescribed by law, and shall have custody of the books, records, buildings and all other 14 property of the university. The board shall elect a 15 16 chairman, secretary and treasurer, who shall perform the 17 duties prescribed in the bylaws of the board. The treasurer shall execute a bond, with approved sureties in 18 19 double the sum likely to come into his hands, for the 20 faithful discharge of his duties. The term of office of 21 board officers the secretary and the treasurer, their duties severally duties of board officers and the times for 22 23 holding meetings shall be fixed in the bylaws of the board.

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A majority of the board constitutes a quorum for the 1 2 transaction of business but a less number may adjourn from 3 time to time, and all routine business may be entrusted to 4 an executive committee of no fewer than three (3) members subject to such conditions as the bylaws of the board 5 The board may from time to time appoint and б prescribe. authorize a person to examine and approve for payment all 7 8 legal claims against the corporation. The person shall 9 give bond with surety approved by the board, payable to the 10 state of Wyoming in such sum as the board may fix, 11 conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties. A 12 certificate of appointment signed by the chairman and secretary of the board and the bond shall be filed with the 13 state auditor. At each meeting of the board all action 14 15 taken by the person so appointed subsequent to the 16 immediately preceding board meeting shall be submitted to 17 the board for its approval or disapproval. The actual and necessary traveling expenses of nonresident members 18 in 19 attending the annual meeting of the board may be audited by 20 the auditing committee thereof and paid by warrant on the 21 treasurer out of the general fund of the university.

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1 2 (b) As used in this act unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, "nominated" or "elected" to public 3 4 office or other similar term shall include the selection of prospective appointees to the University of Wyoming board 5 б of trustees in accordance with W.S. 21-17-201. 7 8 22-2-105. Terms of office and offices voted on at general elections. 9 10 (a) The terms of office and offices voted on at 11 12 general elections are as follows: 13 (ii) Four Year Term. - At the general election 14 in 1974 and in every fourth (4th) year thereafter, there 15 16 shall be elected the following officers: one (1) governor, 17 one (1) secretary of state, one (1) state treasurer, one 18 (1) state auditor, one (1) superintendent of public 19 instruction, county clerks, county treasurers, county 20 assessors, county coroners, county and prosecuting 21 attorneys, district attorneys, sheriffs, clerks of the district court. At the general election in 2020 and in 22 every fourth (4th) year thereafter, there shall be selected 23

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1	two (2) prospective appointees for each of the eight (8)
2	trustee positions on the University of Wyoming board of
3	trustees. At every general election there shall be elected
4	the necessary member or members of the Wyoming senate and
5	county commissioners. The question of retention of a

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20	(a) Nomination applications for United States

Filing fees; exception. 5 б (a) Applications shall be accompanied by the 7 following fees: 8 9 (i) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the offices 10 state senator, state representative, University of of 11 Wyoming board trustee to an appointment district, district 12 attorney and for the offices to be voted for by electors 13 wholly within a county; 14 22-5-215. Nomination of partisan candidates 15 and 16 write-in candidates. 17 On each party ballot the candidate or candidates equal in 18 19 number to the number to be elected to each office who 20 receive the largest number of votes shall be nominated and 21 shall be entitled to have their names printed on the ballot for the next general election. For appointed positions on 22 the University of Wyoming's board of trustees, the two (2) 23 11 HB0083

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1 candidates who receive the largest number of votes on each 2 party ballot shall be nominated and shall be entitled to 3 have their names printed on the ballot for the next general 4 election. A write-in candidate shall not be nominated and shall not be entitled to have his name printed on the 5 ballot for the next general election unless he received at 6 least twenty-five (25) write-in votes. An unsuccessful 7 8 candidate for office at a primary election whose name is 9 printed on any party ballot may not accept nomination for 10 the same office at the next general election. 11 12 22-6-117. Order of listing offices in partisan elections. 13 14 The major party primary and general partisan 15 (a) 16 election ballots shall contain the offices to be voted on 17 in the following order: 18 19 (xii) Candidates for University of Wyoming board 20 trustees. 21 22-6-120. Format of general election ballot. 22 23

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(a) The general election ballot shall be printed in
 substantial compliance with this format:

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4 (x) Below the names of candidates for each 5 office shall be printed blank lines for write-in candidates 6 equal in number to the number of persons to be elected. In 7 the case of selection of University of Wyoming board 8 trustees for appointment, two (2) blank lines for write-in 9 candidates shall be printed for each person to be appointed 10 by the governor;

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12 22-16-116. Statewide abstract; discrepancies with
13 county abstracts.

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From the unofficial tabulations delivered directly to his 15 16 office, the secretary of state shall tabulate a statewide 17 abstract by counties of votes for president and vice-president, state officers, justice of the supreme 18 19 court, United States senator, representative in congress, 20 district court judges, circuit court judges, members of the 21 state legislature, University of Wyoming board trustee and 22 the votes for and against ballot propositions voted on by 23 electors of a district larger than a county. The unofficial

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tabulation shall then be reconciled to the official
 abstracts of the county canvassing boards and the secretary
 of state shall prepare the state abstract from the official
 county abstracts.

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6 22-16-121. Certificates of nomination, selection and 7 election following state or county canvass.

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9 The governor shall issue a certificate of (b) 10 election to a candidate duly elected to an office to be filled by electors of the state, district court judges, 11 12 circuit court judges and members of the state legislature. 13 The governor shall issue a certificate of selection to a candidate duly selected for prospective appointment to the 14 office of University of Wyoming board trustee. The county 15 16 clerk shall issue a certificate of election to each candidate duly elected to a county or precinct office in 17 the county and to members elected to boards of trustees of 18 19 special districts, school or community college districts 20 and city or town councils.

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22 22-25-107. Where reports to be filed.

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(a) All reports required under this chapter shall be
 filed as follows:

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4 (iii) Any candidate for statewide office or
5 <u>University of Wyoming board trustee</u> shall file with the
6 secretary of state;

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8 **Section 3.** W.S. 21-17-202(b) is repealed.

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Section 4. New members to the University of Wyoming 10 board of trustees shall be selected in accordance with this 11 12 act in the 2020 general election. Pursuant to W.S. 21-17-201, as amended by this act, the governor shall 13 nominate and, with the advice and consent of the Wyoming 14 senate, appoint members to the University of Wyoming board 15 16 of trustees. The terms of an existing board member not 17 selected through a general election shall expire when a successor, designated by the governor, is duly appointed to 18 19 that existing board member's position. All existing board 20 members' term shall expire not later than March 31, 2021. 21

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Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
