- 11 (b)(ii), (iii) and (g), 9-2-1006(a), 9-2-1013(b),
- 9-2-1022(a)(xi)(F)(VI) and 9-4-206(b) are amended to read:

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14 9-2-1005. Payment of warrants; budget powers of

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15 governor; agency budgets; federal funds; new employees.

1 (a) No warrant shall be drawn by the auditor or paid 2 by the treasurer: 3 4 (iv) If the expenditure is in nonconformance with the amounts, programs and approved budget authorized 5 by legislative appropriation acts except upon notice to the 6 <u>legislature</u> if required and approval of the governor as 7 8 provided by subsection (b) of this section; 9 10 (vii) If the expenditure is for salaries for 11 employees exceeding the maximum number of employees for the 12 agency authorized by a legislative appropriation act except upon notice to the legislature if required and approval of 13 the governor as provided by subsection (b) of this section; 14 15 16 (xi) If the expenditure is requested 17 federal revenues exceeding the amount authorized by a legislative appropriation act except upon notice to the 18 19 <u>legislature</u> and approval of the governor as provided by 20 subsection (b) of this section; 21 Subject to subsection (c) of this section, the 22 23 governor may:

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(ii) Authorize revisions, changes,
redistributions or increases to amounts authorized for
expenditure by legislative appropriation acts from
non-general fund sources after notifying the legislature
that <u>if</u> in his opinion an emergency financial situation

any legislative appropriations act may be accepted or expended until approved by the governor in writing. with a copy to the joint appropriations interim committee. If the governor disapproves the acceptance or expenditure of federal funds under this subsection and the federal funds are accepted or expended, the state auditor shall not draw any warrant nor shall the state treasurer pay any warrant which would result in the disbursement of funds, directly or indirectly through contracts for services, to the public or private entity involved. For any acceptance or expenditure of federal funds under this paragraph in excess

22	(a) Revenues or income from any source collected,							
23	received or accruing to any agency shall not become a part							

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- 1 of its appropriation or budget unless such revenues or
- 2 income is specified by law to be used for such purpose and
- 3 is approved by the governor <u>after notice</u> is provided to the
- 4 <u>legislature</u> pursuant to W.S. 9-2-1005(b). Any amount added
- 5 to its appropriation or budget constitutes the entire
- 6 appropriation for the full fiscal period.

- 8 9-2-1013. State budget; distribution of copies to
- 9 legislators; copies and reports of authorizations;
- 10 interfund loans.

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- 12 (b) The budget division of the department shall
- 13 furnish to the legislative service office copies of all
- 14 authorizations by the governor pursuant to W.S. 9-2-1005(b)

4 (b) Supplemental additions to approved budgets for acceptance and expenditure of federal funds authorized for 5 acceptance by the governor <u>after notice</u> is provided to the 6 <u>legislature pursuant to W.S. 9-2-1005(b)</u> shall be 7 8 writing, signed by the governor or his designated 9 representative with copies to the state auditor and 10 department of administration and information. Upon approval 11 by the governor, federal revenue that is accepted and which 12 will result in a saving or replacement of state monies to accomplish a budgeted activity or function shall be 13 transferred to the general fund with appropriate 14 15 explanation.
