15 WYOMING OUTDOOR RECREATION TRUST FUND

1 2 9-2-3101. Short title. 3 4 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Wyoming Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund Act." 5 6 7 9-2-3102. Definitions. 8 (a) As used in this act: 9 10 11 (i) "Board" means the Wyoming outdoor recreation 12 trust fund account board created by W.S. 9-2-3104; 13 14 (ii) "Division" means the division of state parks and historic sites within the department of state 15 parks and cultural resources, or its successor; 16 17 18 (iii) "Income account" means the Wyoming outdoor 19 recreation trust fund income account created by W.S. 20 9-2-3103(b); 21 (iv) "Outdoor recreational infrastructure" means 22 23 trailheads, trails, shooting ranges, boat ramps, cell

- 1 towers, motorized and nonmotorized play areas and other
- 2 related physical and organizational structures and
- 3 facilities;

- 5 (v) "Trust account" means the Wyoming outdoor
- 6 recreation trust fund account created by W.S. 9-2-3103(a);

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- 8 (vi) "This act" means W.S 9-2-3101 through
- 9 9-2-3107.

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- 11 9-2-3103. Wyoming outdoor recreation trust fund
- 12 account and income account; creation; source of funds.

- 14 (a) The Wyoming outdoor recreation trust fund account
- 15 is created. The trust account shall consist of those funds
- 16 designated to the account by law and all monies collected
- 17 from federal grants and other contributions, grants, gifts,
- 18 bequests and donations to the trust account. The trust
- 19 account is specifically empowered to accept grants, gifts,
- 20 transfers, bequests and donations. Funds deposited within
- 21 the trust account shall be inviolate and constitute a
- 22 perpetual trust fund which shall be invested by the state
- 23 treasurer as authorized under W.S. 9-4-715(a), (d) and (e)

1 and in a manner to obtain the highest return possible

2 consistent with preservation of the trust account corpus.

3

4 (b) The Wyoming outdoor recreation trust fund income account is created. 5 The state treasurer shall credit annually to the income account interest on funds in the 6 income account and in the trust account and income earned 7 8 from the investment of funds in the income account and the 9 trust account corpus, except no funds shall be credited to 10 the income account under this subsection, and shall be instead credited to the trust account, until the corpus of 11 12 the trust account equals four million dollars (\$4,000,000.00) or until July 1, 2022, whichever occurs 13 may, from 14 earlier. The legislature time to time, 15 appropriate funds directly to the income account for 16 distribution in accordance with the terms of this act. Such 17 specially appropriated funds shall be credited directly by the state treasurer to the income account. No funds shall 18 19 be expended from the income account until appropriated by 20 the legislature.

(c) Individuals and other entities may grant, give,

23 transfer, bequest or donate funds to the trust account or

2 may specify in writing whether the funds should be credited

3 to the trust account or the income account.

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5 (d) Subject to legislative appropriation,

6 expenditures from the income account shall only be for the

7 following:

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9 (i) No more than eighty percent (80%) of the

10 funds in the income account per annum may be disbursed by

11 the board for:

13 (A) Grants for the planning, design,

14 improvement and maintenance of existing or potential

15 outdoor recreational infrastructure tied to local

16 governmental entities, the state or the federal government,

17 including grants for the purchase of public access

18 easements necessary to enhance these lands;

20 (B) Outdoor recreation related education

21 and public outreach.

1	(ii) No more than twenty percent (20%) of the
2	funds in the income account per annum may be expended for
3	necessary administrative expenses incurred by the board
4	under this act and for the operation, administration and
5	maintenance of the division to enhance and expand the
6	outdoor recreation industry and improve outdoor recreation
7	infrastructure and access within the state.

L2	(a) The Wyoming outdoor recreation trust fund account
L3	board is created. The board shall consist of six (6)
L4	members, as follows:

16 (i) The administrator of the division or his 17 designee who shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member 18 of the board; and

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20 (ii) Five (5) members appointed by the governor 21 and confirmed by the senate. The members shall be Wyoming 22 residents and knowledgeable in the area of outdoor recreation. Membership on the board shall reflect the broad 23

- 1 spectrum of interests involved in outdoor recreation. Not
- 2 more than one (1) member shall be from any given county.

- 4 (b) Except for the initial board, each appointed
- 5 member of the board shall serve for a term of six (6)
- 6 years. Of the initial appointees, one (1) member shall be
- 7 appointed for two (2) years, two (2) members shall be
- 8 appointed for four (4) years and two (2) members shall be
- 9 appointed for six (6) years. The governor may remove any
- 10 member as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. Board members may be
- 11 reappointed for a maximum of one (1) additional six (6)
- 12 year term. A vacancy on the board shall be filled by the
- 13 governor for the balance of the unexpired term. The board
- 14 shall select one (1) of its appointed members to serve as
- 15 chairman.

- 20 (a) The board shall meet not less than two (2) times
- 21 each year. Members shall serve without compensation but,
- 22 subject to legislative appropriation, shall be reimbursed
- 23 from the income account for expenses incurred in the

- 1 performance of their duties in the manner and amounts
- 2 provided by law for legislators.

- 4 (b) The board shall receive and evaluate applications
- 5 for grants from the income account as authorized under W.S.
- $6 \quad 9-2-3103(d)(i)$.

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- 8 (c) The board shall annually report to the governor,
- 9 the joint appropriations committee and the joint travel,
- 10 recreation, wildlife and cultural resources interim
- 11 committee no later than October 1 with respect to all:

- (i) Federal grants, state appropriations and
- 14 other contributions, grants, gifts, bequests and donations
- 15 received and credited to the Wyoming outdoor recreation
- 16 trust fund during the preceding fiscal year; and

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- 18 (ii) Grants awarded by the board to nonprofit
- 19 and governmental organizations.

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- 21 (d) The board shall review and monitor grants to
- 22 grantees and expenditure of monies from the income account

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23 to the board and the division.

2 (e) The board shall adopt rules and regulations in

3 accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act as

4 necessary to carry out its duties under this act, including

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22 may:

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1 (i) Consult as necessary with other governmental 2 agencies, persons and nonprofit organizations; 3 4 (ii) Accept or decline federal grants and other contributions, grants, gifts, transfers, bequests 5 and donations of any money or personal property from any 6 7 source. 8 9 9-2-3106. Disbursement of grants from the income 10 account. 11 12 (a) Subject to application approval and legislative appropriation, the board may award grants as authorized 13 under W.S. 9-2-3103(d)(i) and consistent with the rules of 14 the board. 15 16 17 (b) The board shall have the discretion to determine the amount of money awarded under each grant and any 18 19 conditions attached to the grant. 20 21 (c) No funds shall be expended for grants from the 22 income account except upon specific legislative authorization as provided under W.S. 9-2-3105(c). 23

Biennial audit; report by board. 3 4 (a) The director of the department of audit or his designee shall audit the trust account and the income 5 account. 6 7 8 (b) The board shall annually report to the governor, the joint appropriations committee and the joint travel, 9 10 recreation, wildlife and cultural resources 11 committee not later than September 1 with respect to all: 12 (i) Federal grants, state appropriations and 13 other contributions, grants, gifts, bequests and donations 14 received and credited to the trust account or income 15 16 account during the preceding fiscal year; 17 (ii) Grants awarded and funds disbursed by the 18 19 board under W.S. 9-2-3103(d)(i); 20 21 (iii) Funds disbursed by the board to the

division under W.S. 9-2-3103(d)(ii).

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1 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon

completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 2

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 3
