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- 13 (a) To obtain the permit required by W.S. 18-5-502,
- 14 the owner or developer of a wind energy facility shall

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- 1 submit an application to the board of county commissioners.
- 2 The application shall:

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4 (i) Certify that reasonable efforts have been

5 undertaken to provide notice in writing to all owners of

6 land within one (1) mile of the proposed wind energy

7 facility, and to all cities and towns located within twenty

8 (20) miles of the wind energy facility and to the military

9 installation commander if there are any active federal

10 military missile launch or control facilities within five

11 (5) miles of the proposed wind energy facility. Notice

12 shall include a general description of the project

13 including its location, projected number of turbines and

14 the likely routes of ingress and egress;

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16 18-5-504. Minimum standards; incorporation into other

17 processes; pre-construction approval.

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19 <u>(d) Before vertical construction of a wind turbine</u>

20 <u>within two (2) nautical miles from any active federal</u>

21 military missile launch or control facility, a wind energy

22 facility shall obtain written approval from the military

23 <u>installation commander or the commander's written designee,</u>

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a determination of no hazard from the federal aviation

2 administration and documentation from the federal military
3 aviation and installation assurance siting clearinghouse
4 that resolves any potential adverse impact on military
5 operations and readiness and that commits to implement
6 required mitigation measures.

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8 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2020.
