A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to Medicaid; requiring collaboration

2 concerning the expansion of Medicaid eligibility;

3 authorizing the expansion of Medicaid eligibility as

4 specified; requiring reports and notice as specified;

5 repealing prior authorizations; providing a sunset

6 provision; and providing for an effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10 Section 1.

12 (a) As directed by the governor, the insurance

13 commissioner of this state and the director of the

14 department of health shall collaborate together and work

15 with the centers for Medicare and Medicaid services of the

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- 1 United States department of health to explore options for
- 2 the expansion of Medicaid eligibility as authorized by the
- 3 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, P.L. 111-148 or
- 4 any other federal law that replaces that act before the
- 5 repeal of this section.

- 7 (b) If the collaboration required by subsection (a)
- 8 of this section reveals viable and fiscally advantageous
- 9 options as determined by the governor for the expansion of
- 10 Medicaid eligibility in Wyoming, the governor by and
- 11 through the department of health is authorized to pursue
- 12 any Medicaid state plan amendments or other waivers that
- 13 are necessary and prudent for the expansion.

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- 15 (c) Before making application to expand Medicaid
- 16 eligibility pursuant to subsection (b) of this section, the
- 17 governor shall provide notice to the legislature in
- 18 writing. The governor also shall provide a report to the
- 19 joint labor, health and social services interim committee
- 20 and the joint appropriations committee detailing the
- 21 reasons for the expansion, the means for having the
- 22 expansion approved, the amount of any funding necessary for
- 23 the expansion and the reasons that the expansion is viable

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- 1 and fiscally advantageous for Wyoming. The notice and
- 2 reports shall be submitted to the legislature not less than
- 3 three (3) months before the governor makes application to
- 4 expand Medicaid eligibility under this act to allow the
- 5 legislature adequate notice to call a special session for
- 6 consideration of the expansion before the effective date of
- 7 any obligations binding on the state.

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- 9 (d) This section is repealed effective January 1,
- 10 2023.

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- 12 Section 2. 2013 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 116,
- 13 Section 5 is repealed.

14

- 15 **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon
- 16 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
- 17 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
- 18 Constitution.
