Scope of W.S. 33-26-501 through 33-26-511; signature authority. 5 6 (a) This article does not apply to persons enrolled 7 in a physician assistant education program. approved by the 8 9 board. 10 (b) A physician assistant assists in the practice of 11 12 is an individual who practices medicine, under the supervision of a licensed physician. Within the 13 physician/physician assistant relationship, physician 14 15 assistants exercise autonomy in medical decision making and 16 A physician assistant is qualified by the individual's education, training and experience to provide a broad range 17 18 of diagnostic, therapeutic and health promotion and disease 19 prevention services. The A physician assistant may perform 20 those duties and responsibilities delegated to him by the 21 supervising physician when the duties and responsibilities are provided under the supervision of a licensed physician 22 23 approved by the board, within the scope of the physician's

practice and expertise and within the skills of the physician assistant. collaborate with or refer to the appropriate member of a healthcare team as indicated by the condition of the patient and the education, experience and competence of the physician assistant and current standard of care. The degree of collaboration shall be determined at the practice level, which may include decisions made by the employer, group, hospital service or the credentialing and privileging systems.

(e) Except as otherwise provided by law and including the restriction in W.S. 33-26-510(c), a physician assistant acting within the scope of the physician assistant's practice—may fulfill any requirement for a signature, certification, stamp, verification, affidavit, endorsement or other acknowledgement by a physician. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to expand the scope of practice of a physician assistant as provided in this article or to expand the duties and responsibilities delegated to a physician assistant by the physician assistant's supervising physician.

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- 21 (c) A physician assistant may prescribe medications
- 22 only as an agent of the supervising physician. A physician
- 23 assistant may shall not prescribe schedule I drugs as

- 1 defined by W.S. 35-7-1013 through 35-7-1014. The
- 2 supervising physician may delegate authority to the A
- 3 physician assistant to may prescribe schedule II, III, IV
- 4 or V drugs as defined by W.S. 35-7-1015 through 35-7-1022.
- 5 A physician assistant may dispense prepackaged medications
- 6 in rural clinics when pharmacy services are not physically
- 7 available. The board shall, after consultation with the
- 8 state board of pharmacy, promulgate rules and regulations
- 9 governing the prescription of medications by a physician
- 10 assistant.

- 14 (g) are repealed.
