8 Whenever the powers and duties of the office of the governor of the state of Wyoming devolve upon any other 9 10 person as provided in W.S. 9-1-211(a), the person acting as 11 governor shall continue to act as governor until the end of 12 the term of the governor if the office is assumed less than 13 sixty (60) days one hundred ten (110) days before the last date for an election under W.S. 22-2-104(d) occurring 14 before the next general election. If the office is assumed 15 16 more than sixty (60) days one hundred ten (110) days before 17 the date for an election under W.S. 22-2-104(d) occurring 18 before a general election the person acting as governor 19 shall issue an additional proclamation calling for the 20 election of a governor to fill the unexpired term, which 21 election shall take place at the same time as the general election, and the election, together with the returns and 22 23 canvass thereof, shall be conducted in all respects as

If a vacancy occurs in any office specified under W.S. 22-18-103 other than the governor or 6 7 member of the state legislature, the governor shall 8 immediately notify in writing the chairman of the state central committee of the political party which the last 9 10 incumbent represented at the time of his election under 11 W.S. 22-6-120(a)(vii), or at the time of his appointment if 12 not elected to office. The chairman shall call a meeting of 13 the state central committee to be held not later than fifteen (15) days after he receives notice of the vacancy. 14 At the meeting the state central committee shall select and 15 16 transmit to the governor the names of three (3) persons 17 qualified to hold the office. Within five (5) days after 18 receiving these three (3) names, the governor shall fill 19 the vacancy by temporary appointment of one (1) of the 20 three (3) to hold the office.
