(a) Notwithstanding W.S. 6-4-403(b)(iv), No person 1 2 shall knowingly and willfully cause or permit any child to: 3 4 (i) Absorb, inhale or otherwise ingest any 5 amount of methamphetamine or fentanyl; 6 7 (ii) Remain in a room, dwelling or vehicle where 8 the person knows methamphetamine or fentanyl is being manufactured or sold; or 9 10 11 (iii) Enter and remain in a room, dwelling or 12 vehicle that the person knows is being used to manufacture or store **fentanyl** or methamphetamines, or the hazardous 13 waste created by the manufacture of fentanyl or 14 15 methamphetamines. 16 17 (b) No person having the care or custody of a child shall knowingly and willfully permit the child to remain in 18 19 a room, dwelling or vehicle where that person knows that 20 methamphetamine or fentanyl is possessed, stored or ingested. 21
