1 AN ACT relating to trade and commerce; requiring the office of homeland security to establish a reporting system for 2 3 concerns regarding critical infrastructure as specified; authorizing the governor to specify countries and companies 4 5 to critical infrastructure; threats providing specifying applicability; providing 6 definitions; an 7 appropriation; authorizing positions; and providing for an 8 effective date.

3 **19-13-501.** Definitions.

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5 (a) As used in this article:

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7 (i) "Critical infrastructure" means an asset,
8 system, network or facility, whether physical or cyber,
9 that are considered so vital to the state of Wyoming that
10 the incapacitation or destruction of the asset, system,

11 network or facility would have a debilitating effect on

12 security, public health or safety. "Critical

13 infrastructure" includes any asset, system, network or

14 facility that involves chemical facilities, commercial

15 facilities, communications, critical manufacturing, dams,

16 defense industrial bases, emergency services, energy,

17 financial services, food and agriculture, government,

18 health care and public health, information technology,

19 nuclear reactors, materials and waste, transportation

20 systems and water and wastewater systems;

22 (ii) "Cyber" means the measures taken to protect 23 a computer, computer network, computer system or other

1 technology infrastructure against unauthorized use or 2 access; 3 4 (iii) "Designated country" means: 5 6 (A) Any country that has been designated as 7 a state sponsor of terrorism under federal law; or 8 9 (B) A country designated by the governor as a threat to critical infrastructure under W.S. 19-13-502. 10 11 12 (iv) "Director" means the director of the office of homeland security; 13 14 (v) "Governmental entity" means the state of 15 Wyoming, any political subdivision of the state, city, 16 17 town, county or special district, or any agency or entity 18 thereof. 19 20 19-13-502. 1 (a) The governor, after consultation with the

2 director, may designate a country as a threat to critical

3 infrastructure for purposes of this article. The governor

4 may consult with the office of homeland security and any

5 relevant state or federal agency before making any

6 designation under this section.

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8 (b) The governor may, in the governor's discretion,

9 disseminate information about the countries designated

10 under subsection (a) of this section.

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15 (a) The director shall establish a system for

16 governmental entities and other persons to report

17 suspicious activity, potential threats or risks to critical

18 infrastructure from designated countries or persons from

19 designated countries in Wyoming. The system shall include,

20 at a minimum:

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22 (i) Allow for the submission of information

23 online or by telephone;

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2 (ii) Provide for the submission of information

3 concerning:

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5 (A) Real property purchases and leases of

6 land adjacent to critical infrastructure by designated

7 countries or persons from designated countries;

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9 (B) Contracts where a designated country or

10 a person from a designated country is a party and where the

11 designated country or person is granted access to critical

12 infrastructure, whether by physical, remote or other means;

14 (C) Any other suspicious activity, threat

15 or risk from a designated country or person from a

16 designated country that the director requires to be

17 included as part of the reporting system.

19 (iii) A method by which reports of suspicious

20 activity, threats or risks submitted under this section are

21 disseminated to the governor and any appropriate state or

1 (b) The director may utilize any existing system to

2 implement the reporting system required by this section.

4 (c) The director shall provide information on the

5 reporting system required by this section and how

6 governmental entities and persons may report to Wyoming

7 residents and governmental entities, including county

8 clerks and law enforcement agencies.

12 (a) There is authorized two (2) full-time employee

13 positions to the office of the governor for the office of

14 homeland security for purposes of implementing this act.

15 One (1) of the positions authorized in this subsection

16 shall be for a critical infrastructure analyst. The

17 remaining one (1) position authorized in this subsection

18 shall be for a critical infrastructure energy analyst.

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20 (b) There is appropriated two hundred three thousand

21 dollars (\$203,000.00) from the general fund to the office

22 of the governor for the office of homeland security for

23 purposes of implementing this act and funding the two (2)

- 1 positions authorized in subsection (a) of this section.
- 2 This appropriation shall be for the period beginning July
- 3 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024 and shall not be expended
- 4 for any other purpose. Any unexpended, unobligated funds
- 5 remaining from this appropriation on June 30, 2024 shall
- 6 revert as provided by law on June 30, 2024.

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- 8 (c) It is the intent of the legislature that the two
- 9 (2) positions authorized and the appropriation provided in
- 10 this section be included in the governor's standard budget
- 11 request for the immediately succeeding fiscal biennium.

13 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2023.
