- 28 one hundred eighteen dollars (\$366,118.00) is effective immediately.

- 30 2. It is the intent of the legislature that funds appropriated to the
- 31 state engineer for the board of control division shall be made from the
- 32 general fund in the 2025-2026 fiscal biennium and any subsequent fiscal
- 33 biennium.

2 Section 10.

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The water development office is authorized one 4 (1) full-time employee for an upper Colorado river basin 5 project coordinator. There is appropriated one hundred 6 7 twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000.00) from the general fund to water development account I as created by W.S. 8 9 41-2-124(a)(i) for purposes of funding the position created 10 by this section for the period beginning July 1, 2023 and 11 ending June 30, 2024. These funds shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, 12 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation on June 13 30, 2024 shall revert as provided by law. It is the intent 14 15 of the legislature that this appropriation and this fulltime employee be included in the standard budget for the 16 17 water development office for the immediately succeeding

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fiscal biennium.

20 (b) There is appropriated five hundred thousand 21 dollars (\$500,000.00) from the general fund to water 22 development account I as created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(i) for 23 the purpose of engaging the services of consultants and

- 1 other qualified professionals as needed to assist with
- 2 upper Colorado river basin projects or potential projects.
- 3 These funds shall not be transferred or expended for any
- 4 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds
- 5 remaining from this appropriation on July 1, 2026 shall
- 6 revert as provided by law.
