## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to marketing homemade foods; specifying that any person may sell eggs or dairy products pursuant to 2 3 the Wyoming Food Freedom Act; prohibiting a state standard 4 for food and health inspection for homemade foods that is 5 more stringent than any standard promulgated by the United б State department of agriculture; and providing for an effective date. 7 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10 11 Section 1. W.S. 11-49-102(a) by creating a new paragraph (xii) and by renumbering (xii) as (xiii) and 12 13 11-49-103(c)(i), (vi), (d)(intro), (e), (k) and (m) are 14 amended to read:

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         11-49-102. Definitions.
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         (a) As used in this act:
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             (xii) "Designated agent" means a person employed
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    by the producer to facilitate sales transactions, including
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    marketing, transport, storage and delivery of food or drink
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    products. A designated agent shall be named in writing by
    the producer and shall not take ownership of any food or
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    drink product.

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         (c) Transactions under this act shall:
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             (i) Be directly between the seller producer and
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    the informed end consumer, except as otherwise provided by
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    this act. A producer may employ a designated agent to
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facilitate a transaction. The seller of eggs, dairy 1 2 products or a homemade food product consisting of 3 non-potentially hazardous food may be the producer of the 4 item, an agent of the producer or a third party vendor including a retail shop or grocery store as long as the 5 sale is made in compliance with this act. The seller of a 6 homemade food item consisting of potentially hazardous 7 8 food, except eggs and dairy products, shall be the producer of the item; 9

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(vi) Only occur at farmers markets, farms, ranches, producer's homes or offices, the retail location of the third party seller of non-potentially hazardous foods, eggs and dairy products or any location the producer and the informed end consumer agree to.

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17 (d) Except for raw, unprocessed fruits and vegetables, food shall not be sold or used in 18 any 19 commercial food establishment unless the food has been 20 labeled, licensed, packaged, regulated or inspected as 21 required by law. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the sale of homemade food from a retail space located at the 22 ranch, farm or home where the food is produced or at the 23

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retail location of a third party seller for non-potentially 1 2 hazardous food, eggs and dairy products. A retail space selling homemade food under this section shall inform the 3 4 end consumer that the homemade food has not been inspected and shall display a sign indicating that the homemade food 5 6 has not been inspected. If a retail space selling potentially hazardous food, except eggs and dairy products, 7 8 in way associated with a commercial is any food 9 establishment or offers for sale any inspected product, the 10 retail space selling potentially hazardous homemade food shall comply with rules adopted by the department of 11 12 agriculture which shall require:

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(e) The producer shall inform the end consumer that 14 any food product or food sold at a farmers market or 15 16 through ranch, farm or home based sales pursuant to this 17 not certified, labeled, licensed, packaged, act is regulated or inspected. A third party seller offering 18 19 non-potentially hazardous food, eggs or dairy products for 20 sale pursuant to this act shall inform the end consumer 21 that the homemade food is not certified, labeled, licensed, packaged, regulated or inspected. 22

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1 In addition to the requirements of this section, (k) 2 for sales of non-potentially hazardous food, eggs and dairy 3 products at a retail location or grocery store the food 4 shall not be displayed or offered for sale on the same 5 shelf display as food produced in licensed or a establishment and shall be clearly and prominently labeled 6 with "this food was made in a home kitchen, is not 7 regulated or inspected and may contain allergens". 8 9 10 (m) In addition to the transactions permitted under

11 this act, homemade food producers may sell homemade food 12 and drink products, or eggs or dairy products to the maximum extent permitted by federal law. The department of 13 agriculture shall not promulgate any standard for food and 14 15 health inspection that is applicable to this act that is 16 more stringent than a standard established by the United 17 States department of agriculture and nothing in this article shall be construed to be more restrictive than 18 19 applicable federal requirements.

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21 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2023.
