## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; extending the time

- 2 period for the temporary registration of vehicles owned by
- 3 nonresident persons employed in Wyoming; and providing for

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-2-201(j) is amended to read:

10 31-2-201. Registration required; timelines.

- 12 (j) Any nonresident owner, lessee or operator of a
- 13 vehicle that is not a commercial vehicle, who is employed
- 14 in this state on a temporary or full-time basis may choose

to purchase a temporary worker registration permit from the 1 2 county treasurer in lieu of registering the vehicle 3 pursuant to paragraph (a)(iv) of this section and paying 4 the fees pursuant to W.S. 31-3-101, provided the vehicle displays a valid registration and license plate from 5 another jurisdiction and is properly insured. Application 6 for the temporary worker registration permit shall be made 7 8 to the county treasurer in the manner and form prescribed 9 by the department and shall be submitted with proof of 10 valid insurance. The temporary worker registration permit 11 shall bear a distinctive number assigned to the vehicle, an 12 expiration date and at all times be prominently displayed and clearly visible on the vehicle in a manner prescribed 13 by the department. Fees collected under this subsection 14 15 shall be deposited in the county general fund. The fee for 16 a temporary worker registration permit shall be fifty 17 dollars (\$50.00) per each month of required registration, and shall not exceed one hundred twenty (120) one hundred 18 19 eighty (180) days per vehicle.
