## for

1 AN ACT relating to public health and safety; requiring the 2 licensure of surgical abortion facilities as specified; requiring licensed physicians to perform abortions; 3 providing criminal penalties for violations; specifying 4 5 civil liability for damages resulting from abortions; 6 providing definitions; making conforming amendments; 7 specifying applicability; requiring reports; requiring rulemaking; and providing for an effective date. 8 9 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 11 12 Section 1. W.S. 35-6-201 through 35-6-204 are created to read: 13 14 15

ARTICLE 2

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1 REGULATION OF SURGICAL ABORTIONS 2 3 35-6-201. Definitions. 4 (a) As used in this article: 5 б 7 (i) "Abortion" means the act of using or 8 prescribing any instrument, medicine, drug or any other substance, device or means with the intent to terminate the 9 10 clinically diagnosable pregnancy of a woman, including the 11 elimination of one (1) or more unborn babies in a 12 multifetal pregnancy, with knowledge that the termination 13 by those means will, with reasonable likelihood, cause the death of the unborn baby. "Abortion" shall not include any 14 15 use, prescription or means specified in this paragraph if the use, prescription or means are done with the intent to: 16 17 18 (A) Save the life or preserve the health of 19 the unborn baby; 20 21 (B) Remove a dead unborn baby caused by spontaneous abortion or intrauterine fetal demise; 22 23

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1 (C) Treat a woman for an ectopic pregnancy; 2 or 3 4 (D) Provide treatment for a pregnant woman when a medical procedure or treatment is necessary, based 5 on reasonable medical judgment, to save or preserve the б life of the pregnant woman. 7 8 9 (ii) "Hospital" means those institutions 10 licensed by the Wyoming department of health as hospitals; 11 12 (iii) "Physician" means any person licensed to practice medicine in this state; 13 14 (iv) "Pregnancy" or "pregnant" means the human 15 female reproductive condition of having a living unborn 16 17 baby or human being within a human female's body throughout the entire embryonic and fetal stages of the unborn human 18 19 being from fertilization to full gestation and childbirth; 20 21 (v) "Reasonable medical judgment" means а medical judgment that would be made or a medical action 22 that would be undertaken by a reasonably prudent, qualified 23

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1 physician who is knowledgeable about the case and the 2 treatment possibilities with respect to the medical 3 conditions involved;

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5 (vi) "Surgical abortion" means an induced 6 abortion performed or attempted through use of a machine, 7 medical device, surgical instrument or surgical tool, or 8 any combination thereof, to terminate the clinically 9 diagnosable pregnancy of a woman with knowledge and the 10 intent that the termination by those means will cause, with 11 reasonable likelihood, the death of the unborn child;

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(vii) "Surgical abortion facility" means any facility that provides a surgical abortion to a woman and performs not less than three (3) first-trimester surgical abortions in any one (1) month or not less than one (1) second-trimester or third-trimester surgical abortion in any one (1) year.

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35-6-202. Surgical abortion facilities; licensure
requirement; prohibitions; penalties.

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1 (a) Each surgical abortion facility in Wyoming shall 2 be licensed as an ambulatory surgical center in accordance 3 with W.S. 35-2-901 through 35-2-914 and the rules of the 4 department of health. Each surgical abortion facility performing surgical abortions 5 shall have separate а license. 6 7 8 (b) surgical abortion facility shall provide No surgical abortions to any pregnant woman without first 9 10 being licensed as an ambulatory surgical center. 11 12 (c) Each surgical abortion facility shall comply with all rules of the department of health concerning the 13 operation and regulation of ambulatory surgical centers. No 14 license issued to a surgical abortion facility shall be 15 16 transferable or assignable to any other person or facility. 17 (d) Each licensed physician performing at least one 18 19 (1) surgical abortion at a surgical abortion facility

20 shall:

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(i) Report each surgical abortion to thedepartment of health and shall attest in the report that

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1 the physician is licensed and in good standing with the 2 state board of medicine;

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4 (ii) Submit documentation in a form and 5 frequency required by the department of health that demonstrates that the licensed physician has admitting 6 privileges at a hospital located not more than ten (10) 7 8 miles from the abortion facility where the licensed 9 physician is performing or will perform surgical abortions. 10

(e) Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). Each calendar day in which a violation of this section occurs or continues is a separate offense.

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35-6-203. Abortion facilities; surgical abortions;
requirements; rulemaking.

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20 (a) Any surgical abortion performed in the state 21 shall only be performed by a physician licensed in the 22 state of Wyoming.

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1 (b) Any person who performs in the state any surgical 2 abortion in violation of subsection (a) of this section is 3 guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not less 4 than one (1) year nor more than fourteen (14) years.

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6 (c) No person shall perform a surgical abortion in 7 Wyoming who is not a licensed physician with admitting 8 privileges at a hospital located not more than ten (10) 9 miles from the abortion facility where the surgical 10 abortion is performed.

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(d) Any person who violates subsection (c) of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000,00). For purposes of this subsection, each surgical abortion shall constitute a separate offense of subsection (c) of this section.

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18 (e) The department of health shall promulgate rules 19 necessary to regulate surgical abortion facilities as 20 ambulatory surgical centers under W.S. 35-2-901 through 21 35-2-914, provided that the rules:

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1 (i) Applicable to surgical abortion facilities 2 are not less stringent than those rules applicable to 3 ambulatory surgical centers; 4 (ii) Provide for the physical inspection of 5 surgical abortion facilities by the department of health 6 not less than one (1) time per year. 7 8 9 35-6-204. Applicability; effect. 10 11 If any provision of this article conflicts with the Life is a Human Right Act or W.S. 35-6-139, the provisions of the 12 Life is a Human Right Act and W.S. 35-6-139 shall control 13 over this article to the extent that the Life is a Human 14 Right Act and W.S. 35-6-139 are enforceable. 15 16 17 Section 2. 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1	(ii) "Ambulatory surgical center" means a
2	facility which provides surgical treatment to patients not
3	requiring hospitalization and is not part of a hospital or
4	offices of private physicians, dentists or podiatrists.
5	"Ambulatory surgical center" shall include any surgical
6	abortion facility as defined by W.S. 35-6-201(a)(vii);
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8	35-2-908. Rules and regulations.
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10	(a) The department shall promulgate and enforce
11	reasonable rules and regulations necessary to protect the
12	health, safety and welfare of patients of health care
13	facilities licensed under this act.
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15	(b) Not less than thirty (30) days before
16	promulgating or amending any rules regarding the licensure
17	of ambulatory surgical centers, the department shall report
18	to the joint labor, health and social services interim
19	committee if the new or amended rule would impact the
20	operation, inspection or licensure of surgical abortion
21	facilities as defined by W.S. 35-6-201(a)(vii) as
22	ambulatory surgical centers under this act.

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1 Section 3. The department of health shall promulgate all rules necessary to implement this act. 2 3 4 Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 5 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming б Constitution. 7 8 9 (END)

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
