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1 (a) Criminal history record information shall be 2 disseminated by criminal justice agencies in this state, 3 whether directly or through any intermediary, only to: 4 5 (xxvi) The Wyoming professional teaching standards board for purposes of obtaining background 6 information on applications for certification and if 7 8 requested by a school district, to school district boards trustees for obtaining background information 9 of 10 employees who may have access to minors in the course of 11 employment and any volunteer who may have regular contact 12 with or unsupervised access to minors in the course of volunteering for a school district; 13 14 7-19-201. State or national criminal history record 15 16 information. 17 (a) The following persons shall be required to submit 18 to fingerprinting in order to obtain state and national 19 20 criminal history record information: 21 (iii) Applicants for initial certification by 22 the professional teaching standards board and employees 23

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- 1 initially hired by a school district on or after July 1,
- 2 1996, who may have access to minors in the course of their
- 3 employment. In accordance with W.S. 21-3-111(a)(xxi),
- 4 employees of a school district who meet the qualifications

- 7 of volunteering for a school district shall also be
- 8 required to submit to fingerprinting for purposes of this
