(g) The governor may accept in writing on behalf of the state full or partial retrocession of jurisdiction, criminal, civil, juvenile or any combination thereof, over any military reservations and lands previously ceded to the United States in subsections (a) through (f) of this section where such retrocession has been offered by the appropriate federal authority. The governor's written acceptance of full or partial retrocession of jurisdiction under this subsection shall become effective upon the filing of the acceptance in the office of the secretary of state. Nothing in this subsection shall alter, amend, diminish or invalidate rights reserved to the state in
