Law enforcement retirement-contributions.

## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to compensation and benefits; increasing

2 employee and employer contributions for law enforcement

3 officers under the Wyoming Retirement Act; providing

4 appropriations; and providing for an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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8 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-3-432(a) and (b) is amended to

9 read:

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11 9-3-432. Law enforcement officers; contributions;

12 benefit eligibility; service and disability benefits; death

13 benefits; benefit options.

14

15 (a) Each law enforcement officer shall pay into the

16 account eight and six-tenths percent (8.6%) of his salary

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through June 30, 2024 and thereafter eleven and one-tenth 1 2 percent (11.1%) of his salary to fund benefits provided to 3 law enforcement officers. Any contribution required under 4 this subsection or subsection (b) of this section shall be paid by the employer from the source of funds used to pay 5 officer salaries in order to be treated as 6 contributions for the sole purpose of determining tax 7 8 treatment under the United States Internal Revenue Code, § 9 414(h). These payments by the employer are subject to W.S.

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9-3-412(c).

12 Each employer of a law enforcement officer covered under this article shall pay into the account a 13 contribution equal to eight and six-tenths percent (8.6%) 14 15 of the salary paid through June 30, 2024 and thereafter 16 eleven and one-tenth percent (11.1%) of the salary paid to 17 each of its law enforcement officers covered under this article and may pay into the account any amount of the 18 19 officer's share of contributions under subsection (a) of 20 this section. Payments under this subsection shall be made 21 monthly to the account in accordance with W.S. 9-3-413 and are subject to the penalties imposed under W.S. 9-3-413 for 22 delinquent contributions. No additional contribution shall 23

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- 1 be imposed upon the state, any city, town or county for
- 2 benefits provided law enforcement officers under this
- 3 article.

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5 Section 2.

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- 7 (a) There is appropriated to the state auditor from
- 8 the general fund two million twenty-five thousand dollars
- 9 (\$2,025,000.00) to provide payment of the increase in
- 10 employer contributions for executive branch law enforcement
- 11 employees for the 2025-2026 fiscal biennium.

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- 13 (b) There is appropriated to the University of
- 14 Wyoming from the general fund seventy-five thousand dollars
- 15 (\$75,000.00) to provide payment of the increase in employer
- 16 contributions for University of Wyoming law enforcement
- 17 employees for the 2025-2026 fiscal biennium.

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- 19 (c) For state agency employers whose retirement
- 20 contributions are made from non-general fund sources, there
- 21 is appropriated from those accounts and funds amounts
- 22 necessary to provide payment of the increase in employer

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- 1 contribution rates required by W.S. 9-3-432(b), as amended
- 2 by section 1 of this act.

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- 4 (d) The appropriations in this section shall only be
- 5 expended to provide payment of the increase in each state
- 6 agency's employer contribution rates required by W.S.
- 7 9-3-432(b), as amended by section 1 of this act, for the
- 8 2025-2026 fiscal biennium.

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- 10 (e) No amount of the appropriations made in this
- 11 section shall be used to provide the increased employee
- 12 contribution required by this act.

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- 14 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
- 15 appropriations under this section shall not be transferred
- 16 or expended for any purpose other than as specified in this
- 17 section. Any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from
- 18 the appropriations made in this section shall revert as
- 19 provided by law on June 30, 2026.

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- 21 (g) The state auditor shall transfer the funds to the
- 22 state retirement system or to individual state agencies as
- 23 determined by the department of administration and

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1 information to be necessary to meet the provisions of this

2 act.

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4 (h) It is the intent of the legislature that the

5 appropriations made in this section be included in each

6 state agency's standard budget request for the immediately

7 succeeding fiscal biennium.

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9 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2024.
