promulgate rules necessary to carry out this section no 1 2 later than October 1, 1994. Applications for a permit to 3 carry a concealed firearm shall be made available and 4 distributed by the division of criminal investigation and local law enforcement agencies. The permit shall be valid 5 throughout the state for a period of five (5) years from 6 7 the date of issuance. The permittee shall carry the permit, 8 together with valid identification at all times when the 9 permittee is carrying a concealed firearm and shall display 10 both the permit and proper identification upon request of 11 any peace officer. The attorney general through the 12 division shall issue a permit to any person who: 13 14 (v) Has not been: 15 16 (B) Convicted of a felony violation of the 17 Wyoming Controlled Substances Act of 1971, W.S. 35-7-1001 through 35-7-1057 or similar laws of any other state or the 18 19 United States relating to controlled substances and has not 20 been pardoned or had his firearm rights restored pursuant 21 to W.S. 7-13-105(a) or (f); or 22
