7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 9 **Section 1**. W.S. 35-11-103(d)(i)(intro), (B), by
- 10 creating a new subparagraph (D), (ii)(intro), (F), by
- 11 creating a new subparagraph (H) and by creating new
- 12 paragraphs (xii) and (xiii) is amended to read:

14 **35-11-103.** Definitions.

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2 (d) Specific definitions applying to solid waste

3 management:

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5 (i) "Solid waste" means garbage, and other

6 discarded solid materials, materials, including solid waste

7 materials resulting from industrial, commercial, and

8 agricultural operations, and from community activities,

9 but, unless disposed of at a solid waste management

10 facility, does not include any of the following:

11

12 (B) Liquids, solids, sludges or dissolved

13 constituents which are collected or separated in process

14 units for recycling, recovery or reuse including the

15 recovery of energy, within a continuous or batch

16 manufacturing or refining process; or

17

18 (D) Post-use polymers and recovered

19 feedstocks converted at an advanced recycling facility or

20 held at an advanced recycling facility before conversion

21 through an advanced recycling process.

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20 (xiii) "Advanced recycling facility" means a manufacturing facility that receives, stores and converts 21 post-use polymers and recovered feedstocks using advanced 22 23 recycling.

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2 **Section 2.** The environmental quality council, upon

3 recommendation by the department of environmental quality,

4 shall promulgate all rules necessary to implement this act.

9 this section, this act is effective July 1, 2024.

11 (b) Sections 2 and 3 of this act are effective

12 immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a
