9 **Section 1**. W.S. 12-4-416 is created to read:

- 11 12-4-416. Boutique hotel liquor licenses; authorized;
- 12 requirements.

- 15 city or town may issue boutique hotel liquor licenses to

1 applicants who are owners or lessees of a boutique hotel

2 that satisfies all requirements specified in subsection (b)

3 of this section.

5 (b) To qualify for a boutique hotel liquor license

6 under this section, the appropriate licensing authority

7 shall require the boutique hotel to:

9 (i) Have an actual valuation of, or the

11 on the boutique hotel, not less than ten million dollars

12 (\$10,000,000.00). Any valuation under this paragraph shall

13 include the value of the land on which the boutique hotel

20 than thirty-five (35) sleeping rooms for short-term

Restrictions upon license orpermit 2 applicants and holders; license limitation per person. 3 4 (a) A license or permit authorized by this title shall not be held by, issued or transferred to: 5 6 7 (iii) Any person who does not own the building or hold a written lease for the period for which the 8 9 license will be effective containing an agreement by the 10 lessor that alcoholic or malt beverages may be sold upon the leased premises, except as provided by paragraph (iv) 11 12 of this subsection. This paragraph shall not be interpreted to prevent the use of a resort liquor license or a boutique 13 hotel liquor license by a contractor or subcontractor as 14 permitted by W.S. 12-4-403(b); 15 16 17 12-4-403. 10 12-4-404. Sale of beverages for off-premises

11 consumption prohibited.

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13 Resort liquor licensees and boutique hotel liquor licensees

14 shall not sell alcoholic or malt beverages for consumption

15 off the premises owned or leased by the licensee, except

16 pursuant to a catering permit. The dispensing of alcoholic

17 or malt beverages licensed to be sold hereunder shall be

18 controlled by W.S. 12-5-201 and, if a catering permit has

19 been issued, by W.S. 12-4-502(b).

21 **12-4-405.** Annual fee.

- 1 The annual fee for a resort liquor license and a boutique
- 2 hotel liquor license shall be not less than five hundred
- 3 dollars (\$500.00) nor more than three thousand dollars
- 4 (\$3,000.00).

- 7 satellite winery permits; direct shipment of wine; fees;

23 (b) The local licensing authority:

2 (iv) Shall assess a fee of not less than three
3 hundred dollars (\$300.00) nor more than five hundred
4 dollars (\$500.00) payable annually in advance for each
5 microbrewery permit. When dual ownership of a microbrewery
6 permit and a liquor license exists no additional fee shall
7 be assessed other than the retail, restaurant, bar and
8 grill, boutique hotel or resort license fee.

10 12-5-201. Location, regulation and restrictions as to 11 place of sale; inspections.

(f) A holder of a boutique hotel liquor license, a 13 resort retail liquor license, a golf club that holds a 14 retail liquor license, a restaurant liquor license or a 15 16 club limited retail liquor license or a holder of a retail 17 liquor license or restaurant liquor license operating on a guest ranch may dispense alcoholic beverages from any 18 19 location within the boundaries of the licensee's premises. 20 Any holder of a boutique hotel liquor license may sell an 21 unopened bottle of liquor or wine to a registered guest not less than twenty-one (21) years of age for consumption on 22 the holder's premises. The premises shall be a single 23

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1 property within a contiguous boundary upon which the

2 licensee is located and which shall be identified in the

3 license. Any location on the premises where alcoholic

4 beverages are dispensed as approved by the licensing

5 authority shall comply with applicable sanitation and fire

6 hazard requirements and other applicable laws. The

7 licensing authority shall, as often as necessary, inspect

8 the licensed location where alcoholic beverages are

9 dispensed to ensure that the licensee is in compliance with

10 sanitation and fire hazard requirements.
