1 2 (a) As used in this section: 3 4 (i) "Accepting jurisdiction" means a county, city, town or other government entity that is required to 5 6 recognize and accept a license issued by an issuing 7 jurisdiction; 8 9 (ii) "Contractor" means a person employed by and 10 contracting with an owner to improve an owner's property; 11 12 (iii) "Issuing jurisdiction" means the county, city, town or other government entity that issued a license 13 to a contractor; 14 15 16 (iv) "License" means any license or 17 certification necessary for a contractor to perform work in a jurisdiction. 18 19 20 (b) Each county, city, town and other government 21 entity that issues licenses to contractors shall recognize a license issued to a contractor by another county, city, 22

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1 town or other government entity in Wyoming, in accordance
2 with the following:

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4 (i) The contractor's license shall be active, 5 and the contractor shall be in good standing with the 6 issuing jurisdiction, before the accepting jurisdiction 7 shall recognize the license under this section;

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9 (ii) A contractor seeking to have a license 10 recognized by an accepting jurisdiction shall not be 11 required to complete any testing or pay any fees to the 12 accepting jurisdiction for the recognition of the license; 13

14 (iii) Any applications required for recognition 15 of a license by an accepting jurisdiction shall only 16 require the minimum amount of information necessary for the 17 accepting jurisdiction to verify the license and the 18 contractor's good standing in the issuing jurisdiction;

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20 (iv) The accepting jurisdiction may require a 21 contractor to provide proof sufficient for the accepting 22 jurisdiction to confirm that the contractor's license is 23 active and in good standing in the issuing jurisdiction;

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2 (v) Nothing in this subsection shall be 3 construed to: 4 5 (A) Require an accepting jurisdiction to grant privileges to a contractor for a license that is not 6 of a similar type or class to the license granted by the 7 8 issuing jurisdiction; 9 10 (B) Prohibit an accepting jurisdiction from 11 requiring a contractor to complete application requirements 12 and procedures, satisfactorily complete any testing 13 requirements or pay fees if the contractor seeks to perform work in an accepting jurisdiction that is not covered under 14 the license issued by the issuing jurisdiction. 15 16 17 (c) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prohibit any county, city, town or other government entity 18 19 that issues licenses to contractors from entering into 20 agreements for the recognition of licenses obtained in 21 other jurisdictions in Wyoming.
