1 AN ACT relating to state parks and historic sites; 2 requiring legal descriptions by rule; repealing statutory 3 legal descriptions; and providing for an effective date. 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 6 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 36-8-302, 36-8-501 by creating a new 8 subsection (c), 36-8-601(a), 36-8-701(a), 36-8-801(a), 9 36-8-902(a), 36-8-1001(a) and (c) are amended to read: 10 36-8-302. 1	From and after the passage of this act, the land which was
2	granted to the state of Wyoming by act of congress of 1897,
3	which ceded to the state of Wyoming, one (1) square mile of
4	land, managed by the department as of July 1, 2010 in the
5	northeast portion of the Shoshone Indian Reservation, upon
6	which is located the Big Horn Hot Springs, is hereby
7	declared to be and shall hereafter be known as the "Hot
8	Springs State Park". <u>The department shall by rule specify</u>
9	the legal description of the state park.

9	Section 26, Township 15 N. Range 120 W., 6th Principal
10	Meridian, Uinta County, Wyoming described to wit: NW1/4 OF
11	NW 1/4 of the NW1/4 of said Section 26; containing 10
12	acres, more or less.

14	(d) The department of state parks and cultural
15	resources <del>is the successor agency to the department of</del>
16	commerce and the Wyoming recreation commission and shall
17	administer and operate the state park created by this
18	section.in accordance with the plan specified in W.S. 36 8
19	901(e) unless otherwise directed by the legislature.

15	and (c), 36-8-1001(a)(i) and 36-8-1002(a) are repealed.
