Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
Section 1 . W.S. 16-6-101(a)(i)(A) and (H)(II),
16-6-102(e), 16-6-104, 16-6-111 and 16-6-206 are amended to
read:
16-6-101. Definitions.

(a) As used in this act:

(i) "Resident" means a person, partnership,

limited partnership, registered limited partnership,

registered limited liability company or corporation

certified as a resident by the department of employment

prior to bidding upon the contract or responding to a

request for proposal, subject to the following criteria:

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9 (A) Any person who is a citizen of the

10 <u>United States and</u> has been a resident of the state for one

11 (1) year or more immediately prior to bidding upon the

12 contract or responding to a request for proposal; or

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14 (H) A person, partnership, limited 15 partnership, registered limited partnership, registered 16 limited liability company or corporation which has

17 satisfied the following requirements for the period one (1)

18 year or more immediately prior to bidding upon the contract

19 or responding to a request for proposal:

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21 (II) Has continuously employed not

22 less than fifteen (15) full-time employees within the state

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4 16-6-102. Resident contractors; preference limitation

5 with reference to lowest bid or qualified response;

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The department may shall make investigations as 8 necessary to determine whether any person is eligible to 9 receive or continue to hold a certificate of residency. 10 11 The department may require or permit any person to file a 12 statement in writing, under oath or otherwise as to all the 13 facts and circumstances concerning the matter to be 14 investigated. For the purpose of any investigation under 15 this section, the director of the department or any person 16 designated by him may administer oaths and affirmations, 17 subpoena witnesses, and compel their attendance, take 18 evidence and require the production of any books, papers, correspondence, memoranda, agreements or other documents or 19 records, which the director or designated person deems 20 relevant or material to the inquiry. In case of refusal to 21 22 obey a subpoena issued to any person, any Wyoming district

court, upon application by the director, may issue to the

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person an order requiring him to appear before the director 1 2 or the officer designated by him, to produce documentary evidence if so ordered, or to give evidence touching the 3 matter under investigation or in question. Failure to obey 4 the order of the court may be punished by the court as 5 6 contempt of court. 7 16-6-104. Preference for Wyoming materials required 8 9 in contracts. 10 11 Resident Wyoming laborers, workmen and mechanics shall be used upon all work enumerated in W.S. 16 6 102 whenever 12 13 possible and any contract let shall so provide. Wyoming 14 materials and products of equal quality and desirability shall have preference over materials or products produced 15 outside the state and any contract let shall so provide. 16 17 18 16-6-111. Penalty for violating work hours 19 provisions. 20 21 Any person who violates this act is guilty of a misdemeanor 22 punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars

(\$500.00) seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00),

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imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six (6) 1 months, or both. 2 3 16-6-206. Failure to employ state laborers; penalty. 4 5 A person who willfully or intentionally fails to use 6 7 Wyoming laborers as required in this act is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five 8 9 hundred dollars (\$500.00) seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) or by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30)10 11 days six (6) months. Each separate case of failure to 12 employ Wyoming laborers on public works projects 13 constitutes a separate offense. 14 15 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2011.
