A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to military affairs; establishing the Wyoming national guard museum and specifying its oversight by the veterans' commission; specifying duties of the veterans' commission; requiring the promulgation of rules; authorizing the employment of a veterans' commission director and staff; renumbering related statutes; and providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 19-14-110 is created to read:

An executive director may hire and supervise such other staff as may be 12 authorized by the commission and shall be administratively 13 14 supported by the military department;

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STAFF COMMENT

Consistent with the wishes of the Committee, the language used above is relatively generic. generic language is used elsewhere in the Wyoming statutes when authorizing commission directors See e.g. 7-13-423(b)(ii) (Interstate and staff. Commission for Adult Offender Supervision), 14-6-102 (Interstate Commission for Juveniles). statutes, however, sometimes use more specific place limits director's language to on a selection, duties or staff mechanisms/authority. Below are several examples of language used in other statutes:

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21-15-114(c) (School Facilities Commission) The commission shall select and subject to senate confirmation, employ a director who is a Wyoming

resident and who shall have demonstrated infacilities competency planning and construction. The director shall receive annual salary determined by the commission and may be removed from office by the commission or the governor as provided under W.S. 9-1-202(b). In addition to other powers granted under this act, the director may hire necessary staff as approved by legislative appropriation and shall provide administrative support to the commission and carry out this act under the direction of the commission.

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21-18-202(c)(v) (Community College Commission) Appoint a director who shall perform duties as prescribed by the commission. The director shall receive an annual salary as determined by the commission and approved by the governor. The director shall hire staff as required to carry out this act and as approved by the commission. Subject to legislative budget authorization staff salaries shall be established by the director with the approval of the commission;
