- 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
- 12 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-802(a)(i)(B) is amended to read:

2 21-2-802. Powers and duties; teacher certification;

3 suspension and revocation; certification fees; disposition

of collected fees; required data submissions to department

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7 (a) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations:

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board may designate:

certification of 9 (i) For the school 10 administrators, teachers and other personnel to require 11 either examination in specified subjects or the completion 12 of courses in approved institutions, or both. However, 13 nothing in this article shall be construed as permitting the board to impose any additional requirements beyond 14 licensure in his own profession on any person licensed 15 pursuant to title 33 in order for that person to practice 16 his own profession in the schools as an employee of or 17 contractor for a school district. 18 Board rules and 19 regulations shall require the following minimum 20 qualifications any additional qualifications and for 21 additional training in a broad general education as the

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18 (a) The professional teaching standards board shall
19 immediately commence promulgation of rules pursuant to W.S.
20 21-2-802(a)(i)(B), as amended by section 1 of this act. The
21 rules shall adhere to and incorporate the recommendations
22 for certification and training of administrators and

educational leaders contained in the report titled 1 2 Comprehensive Policy Framework for Educational Leadership in Wyoming: A Report from the Wyoming Advisory Committee to 3 the Select Committee on Statewide Education Accountability" 4 submitted pursuant to 2015 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 5 6 179, Section 4(e), dated October 20, 2015. The professional 7 teaching standards board shall consult with the advisory committee to the select committee on statewide education 8 9 accountability in drafting the proposed rules and 10 regulations required by this subsection.

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(b) The professional teaching standards board shall,

at a minimum, include the following in the proposed rules

and regulations required under subsection (a) of this

section:

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(i) Common standards to define competencies and expectations for school administrators necessary to improve the performance of schools and school districts. The standards adopted under this paragraph shall align with the standards contained in the "Professional Standards for Educational Leaders" report issued by the National Policy

21	teaching standards board and the advisory committee to the

1 shall report to the select committee on the rules required

2 under subsection (a) of this section. The report shall

3 include proposed rules inclusive of the requirements

4 contained in subsections (a) and (b) of this section.

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6 Section 3. The advisory committee to the select 7 committee on statewide education accountability continue its study of phase II, leader and teacher support 8 and evaluation, as contained in the Wyoming Accountability 9 10 in Education Act. The advisory committee shall consult 11 with the state board of education, the state superintendent 12 and the professional teaching standards board in 13 performance of the duties assigned under this section. advisory committee shall periodically report to the select 14 committee on the leader and teacher support and evaluation 15 16 system. Not later than October 1, 2016, a final report shall be submitted to the select committee on findings 17 pertaining to system implementation, together with any 18 recommendations. The final report shall include proposed 19 timelines to implement the leader support and evaluation 20 system in school year 2018-2019 and the teacher support and 21 22 evaluation system in school year 2019-2020. The proposed

- 1 timelines shall account for the promulgation of rules to
- 2 govern both programs as required by W.S. 21-2-304(b)(xv)
- 3 and (xvi). The final report shall include recommendations
- 4 for appropriate support and consequences to improve
- 5 performance of leaders and teachers to be administered via
- 6 the statewide system of support required under W.S.
- 7 21-2-204(f). Following receipt of this final report, the
- 8 select committee shall report findings and recommendations
- 9 to the legislature for consideration during the 2017
- 10 general session, including any enabling legislation.

12 Section 4.

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- 14 (a) Notwithstanding 2015 Wyoming Session Laws,
- 15 Chapter 179, Section 4(b), the advisory committee to the
- 16 select committee on statewide education accountability
- 17 shall continue to assist the select committee through
- 18 December 31, 2016. The members appointed under 2011
- 19 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 184, Section 4(d), as amended
- 20 by 2013 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 195, Section 3, shall
- 21 continue to serve on the advisory committee. The
- 22 appointing authority for any member who vacates membership

1 shall fill the vacancy. Any member appointed or serving on

2 the advisory committee who is not an employee of a

3 governmental subdivision or a member of a political

4 subdivision, board or commission shall receive per diem and

5 travel expenses in the manner and amount provided to state

6 employees under W.S. 9-3-103.

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The legislative service office shall staff the 8 select committee on statewide education accountability and 9 10 the advisory committee. The department of education and 11 other state agencies shall provide information and other 12 assistance as requested by the select committee or the 13 advisory committee. The legislative service office may retain consultants as necessary to staff and advise the 14 15 select committee in executing the responsibilities prescribed by this act. The management council may expend 16 17 funds appropriated by the legislature for approved contractual agreements between the council and professional 18
