- 1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government; providing for the protection of Wyoming's constitutional 2 3 rights; making legislative findings regarding the tenth amendment to the United States constitution; establishing 4 related state policy; authorizing the attorney general to 5 take action as specified; and providing for an effective 6 7 date. 8
- 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-14-103 is created to read:
- 13 9-14-103. Tenth amendment quarantees.

2 (a) The legislature finds the tenth amendment to the

3 United States constitution:

5 (i) Guarantees and reserves to the states, or the

6 people, all powers not specifically granted to the federal

7 government;

8

9 (ii) Guarantees to the state that congress and

10 the federal government will not exercise any purported

11 additional control over or commandeer rights belonging to

12 the state; and

14 (iii) Ensures the state retains exclusive power

15 to regulate and govern the state subject only to the powers

16 specifically granted to the federal government by the

17 constitution of the United States and the fourteenth

18 amendment's guarantee that the people and the state of

19 Wyoming exercise their sovereign powers in accordance with

20 each citizen's lawful privileges and immunities and right

21 to due process and equal protection of the law.

(b) The legislature declares it is the state's policy 1 2 to vigorously defend the state's rights whenever the 3 federal government exercises control within the state that 4 violates the prescribed limits of the tenth amendment to 5 the United States constitution without express authority of the state. 6 7 8 (c) The attorney general may seek to take action in any administrative hearing or before any state or federal 9 court to stop the enforcement or administration of any 10 action taken by the federal government that, in the 11 12 attorney general's judgment, violates the tenth amendment. 13 Before intervening in or initiating any lawsuit pursuant to this section, the attorney general shall obtain the 14 15 approval of the governor. 16 17 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 18 19 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 20 Constitution. 21
